### Program Background

- California has a shortage of adult and senior care facilities
  - Specifically, those that accept individuals receiving or applying for:
    - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
    - State Supplementary Payment (SSP)
    - Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI); and
    - Those who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
- It has also seen a decline in the number of SSI/SSP recipients residing in adult and senior care facilities.
- The CCE program was established by <u>Assembly Bill (AB)</u> <u>172</u> to address this issue and the historic gaps in the long-term care continuum.

### CCE Preservation Program Roles

What is Community Care Expansion (CCE) -Preservation Program?

- Funding available to counties for the preservation of licensed residential and senior care facilities serving *qualified residents*.
  - Operating subsidy payments to cover potential or projected operating deficits in existing residential adult and senior care facilities so they can avoid closure, and
  - Capital projects funding to allow facilities to make essential physical repairs or necessary upgrades to avoid closure or make the facility compliant with licensing standards
- Please note, counties are responsible for implementing the program locally. The CCE Preservation Program in Riverside County is respective to Riverside only.

### What is a qualified resident?

- Applicants or recipients of the Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment (SSI/SSP) and applicants or recipients of the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI) who need the care and supervision that is provided by the licensed facility that receives the grant.
- Currently experiencing or at risk of homelessness
- Qualified residents shall not include SSI/SSP or CAPI applicants or recipients who are receiving services through a regional center.

# Are you the owner of your facility?

### Initial Eligibility Requirements



#### Be an existing licensed:

Adult Residential Facility (ARF)
Residential Care Facility for the Elderly (RCFE)
Residential Care Facility for the Chronically III (RCFCI)



Have a critical cash flow gap that places the facility at risk of closure or at risk of reducing the number of beds for qualified residents

Currently serve at least one *qualified resident*.





Be in good standing with the Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) or certify that CCE Preservation Program funding will bring them into good standing. Facilities that receive referrals from regional centers are not eligible for CCE Preservation Program funds.



### Additional Eligibility Requirements

#### Match


- Capital projects only: Facility shall agree to a 10% match of the total project cost
  - Ex: Project cost is \$50,000, facility would be responsible for a \$5000 cash match

#### **Deed Restrictions**

- Purpose: to ensure awarded facilities continue to serve the target population of qualified residents
- \*facility operators that are leasing the property must obtain the owner's consent for the deed restriction

#### **Deed Restriction**

- Operating subsidy payments <u>only</u>: Facility shall agree to a deed restriction for the term of the funding.
- Capital projects <u>only</u>: If applicable, a deed restriction for no less than five (5) years for projects totaling over \$250,000.
- Must be notarized and returned to DPSS



Licensed facilities that meet the CCE Preservation Program funding criteria shall also meet the following conditions throughout the project implementation period:

- 1. Funds shall be used in accordance with the CCE Preservation Program's eligible uses
- 2. Agree to continue serving applicants or recipients of SSI/SSP and CAPI.
- 3. Agree to prioritize applications from qualified residents currently experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
- 4. Remain in good standing with the Community Care Licensing Division.

# Operating Subsidy Payments (OSP)



OSP funding is to be used to cover potential or projected operating deficits in existing residential adult and senior care facilities so they can avoid closure



Facilities will receive up to \$1,000 per qualified resident per month\*



\*as long as funds are available

### <u>Operating</u> Subsidy Payments

- Allowable Costs
  - Utilities
  - Maintenance (including supplies, trash removal, pest control, landscaping)
  - Staff and payroll costs
  - Marketing and leasing
  - Taxes and insurance
  - Office supplies and expenses
  - Accounting
  - Strategic planning

# Excluded OSP Costs

Expenses unrelated to operational costs

Sponsor distributions

Expenses or fees related to change in ownership, limited partner buyout, substitution, or assignment of ownership interest

Expenses or fees related to tort or contract liability

CP funding is to allow facilities to make essential physical repairs or necessary upgrades to avoid closure or make the facility compliant with licensing standards.

Repairs or upgrades may not increase square footage of the facility

### Capital Projects Requirements

- County must determine that the awarded subrecipient has the capacity and ability to manage the capital preservation project and bring the project to fruition
- Facilities must demonstrate their ability to:
  - Manage prevailing wage oversight
  - Provide regular accounting of the funds expended for eligible uses
  - Understand approvals and permitting needed and obtain them
  - Report on key data points required by the CCE program

Please note: the application will ask for a list of past projects within the last 3-5 years that your facility has completed to demonstrate your ability to manage capital projects independently



### Facility Responsibilities for Capital Projects

Facilities will work closely with DPSS throughout the project; however, facilities are ultimately responsible for the following:

- Develop a scope of work
- Select a licensed and certified general contractor
- Manage the construction process
- Post-construction responsibilities
- Reporting responsibilities

### Reporting Expectations

- Facilities will be responsible for providing timely and accurate statistical reports regarding facility and qualified resident outcomes from subsidies provided.
- Some examples of reporting may include:
  - Demographics of qualified residents (*e.g. race, age group, disabling condition, gender identity, sexual orientation*)

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- Number of qualified residents exited
- Type of discharge reason (*e.g. moved out of area*)
- Number of beds occupied by qualified residents with behavioral health needs or serious mental illness
- Number of beds preserved via OSP/CP funds

\*Reporting requirements have not yet been finalized by CDSS


County of Riverside Community Care Expansion (CCE) Preservation Program Participant Attestation Statement

The Community Care Expansion (CCE) Preservation Program was established through <u>Assembly Bill (AB)</u> <u>172</u> (Chapter 696, Statutes of 2021) to fund operational gaps and facility rehabilitation thereby preserving licensed adult residential facilities (ARFs) and residential care facilities for the elderly (RCFEs) throughout the State.

To qualify for CCE Preservation Program funding, licensed ARF/RCFE's must meet the following criteria:

#### 1. Be an existing licensed:

- Adult Residential Facility (ARF) as defined by Title 22, section 80001(a)(5) of the California Code of Regulations (CCR); or
- Residential Care Facility for the Elderly (RCFE) as defined by Title 22, section 87101(r)(5) of the CCR; or
- Residential Care Facility for the Chronically III (RCFCI) as defined in Title 22, section 87801 (r)(5) of the CCR.
- 2. Currently serve at least one qualified resident.
  - A qualified resident is defined as recipients of Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment (SSI/SSP) pursuant to Subchapter 16 (commencing with Section 1381) of Chapter 7 of Title 42 of the United States Code and Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC) section 12000 et seq., and applicants or recipients of the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI) pursuant to WIC section 18937 et seq., who need the care and supervision that is provided by the licensed facility that receives the CCE Preservation program operational subsidy and/or facility repairs and rehabilitation. "Qualified resident" shall not include SSI/SSP or CAPI beneficiaries who are receiving services through a regional center.
- Be in good standing with the Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) or certify that CCE Preservation Program funding will bring them into good standing.
- 4. Have a critical monthly or annual operating and cash flow gap that places the facility at risk of

### Conditions of Award

#### **Operating Subsidy Payments**

- Full title report
- 30 days from notice of tentative award to submit notarized deed restriction
- Signed subrecipient agreement no payments will be made until a contract is in place

#### **Capital Projects**

- Full title report
- Submission of Right to Enter Agreement
- If applicable, submission of notarized deed restriction (for projects over \$250,000)
- Signed subrecipient agreement no payments will be made until a contract is in place
